


We are going to a concert to hear some music and a musical story.






During the concert, we will listen, sing, and do actions.



We will sit down before the performance begins.







The pictures from the book will be on a big screen.

Sometimes in our concert we have shakers, scarves and bubbles.








During the concert join in with the songs, the actions or in whatever way you like.

Bear



Mouse especially loves painting her friends.





Bear promises to keep everyone safe if they give him some of their food.





There is a storm. Mouse waits for Bear to come and help. Then she goes to find him.







Some other mice find Mouse and they look after each other.










At the end of the concert we will clap.

Information about our 'Accessible Concerts':

We want our concerts to be accessible to all young children, including those with additional needs. These Concerteenies events are for everyone: whether your child is neurodiverse, has a hearing or visual impairment, physical or learning disabilities (diagnosed or not), we create a relaxed and supportive environment to help make everyone feel welcome. We have worked with SEND music specialists and teachers to make our Musical Stories inclusive and fun.

- These communication cards are designed to reduce anxiety about new experiences, to familiarise children with the story and to encourage any form of participation.
- Concerts include live music, story-telling and illustrations with a range of verbal and non-verbal communication, as well as multi-sensory elements like bubbles, coloured scarves and percussion. There are lots of options for everyone to get involved in their own way.
- Don't worry if your child makes noise, needs to move around or take some time out. There is a designated chill-out space.
- You are welcome to bring your own ear protectors and fidget toys if you like.
- There are personal, fun and relaxed introductions with as direct language and clear interactions as possible.
- We will try our best to avoid any extreme or unexpected volume or lighting changes.
- There will be a BSL interpreter at some events and the narrator also includes some Makaton signing.
- The venue is wheelchair and buggy-friendly.
- The venue will be open before the event starts so you can come in and familiarise yourself with the space.
- Our friendly team will be happy to support you with any needs.
