EXTRA COVID-RELATED PRECAUTIONS

Concerteenies refers to official advice from the Department for Education and the Musicians' Union. We work in line with the venue's policies and keep informed about any mutual changes. We will update staff, musicians and parents/ carers of any new relevant guidance.

- Entrance is via the main door. Exit is via the Backroom door.
- Audience members and staff are encouraged to wash their hands regularly and antibacterial gel will be provided on arrival.

- Audience members will check in using the contactless Eventbrite app at the front door.
- Audience members can use the venue's Track and Trace system.
- Audience members can make themselves a drink at the end of the bar.
- Where safe to do (ensuring fire regulations and safeguarding considerations are adhered to) doors will be propped open to avoid touching surfaces.
- Audience capacity is restricted to 32 adults plus their children to allow for social distancing. Families will be sat around the room, spaced at 1 metre from others using coloured floor spots. Adults are asked to stay seated throughout the sessions. Children are welcome to move about in the middle of the room.
- Families will be given a box of items for the session that they will leave in place at the end of the session. Fabric materials (scarves) will only be used once per day and then washed before the following week. Metals and wooden instruments can be used and wiped down between sessions (Aquaint, suitable for babies).
- An enhanced cleaning schedule is followed for frequently touched objects such as railings, door, window handles, taps, furniture, floor mats, and bathroom facilities between each session.
- If relevant, adults will be asked to sing at a moderate level.
- Staff, musicians and families are not permitted to attend if they have virus symptoms or if they have come into contact with someone who has tested positive. They will be reminded to self-isolate following current government guidance. Public health advice will be followed regarding whether any groups need to self-isolate as a result of a member of staff or family displaying Covid-19 symptoms.
- Staff, musicians and audience members are required to wear a mask (unless exempt) whilst moving around the building. When seated, they can remove their masks if they wish.
- The musicians will remain on-stage and not go out into the audience.
- Staff and musicians are encouraged to take a Lateral Flow Test within 48 hours before the event.
- Refunds are available up to 1 week before the event. People are welcome to sell their tickets privately.
